


ROCK THE LIBRARY SUMMER READING CHALLENGE

Read any legend or fairy tale.
 2. In Greek mythology, Sisyphus was forced to roll a rock up a mountain.
Read any book about mythology or featuring mythological characters.
 3. The Rosetta Stone was the key to three ancient languages.
Read a book that has words in a language other than English.
 4. Rock the boat! Read about your favorite form of transportation.
 5. Rock the house! Have fun at a library program.
 6. Paintings and drawings done on rocky cave walls
and rock art are the first forms of painting.
Look at a book on drawing or painting.
 7. Minerals, crystals and rocks are all part of our Earth.
Take a look at a book about Earth science.
What is a fun fact that you found out?
 8. Rock of Ages---Read a book set long ago.
 9. We are your rock. Ask a librarian for a recommendation.
 10. The sorcerer's stone in Harry Potter was created by alchemy,
much like transforming print books to electronic ones.
Download an audio or e-book from the library.
 11. Read a book while sitting on a rock. (Real or fake.)
 12. Rock and Roll! Download a free song from the library website.
 13. Find "Harrison Remembers" on the library website and learn about
bedrocks of the Harrison community.
 14. Petrified Rocks! Read a scary story.
 15. Rocket to the stars. Take out the telescope or attend an astronomy
program at the library.
 16. Stepping Stones and other museums. Check out a museum pass
and visit a museum.
 17. Take out a book of recipes and make your favorite one,
Roquefort cheese, optional!
 18. School rock! Find a database on the website that would help with
your homework and let us know which one.
 19. Rock painting and more! Do a craft at the library.
 20. Be a library rock star! Read a book and post a short review to the
library web site.
 21. Rock-a-bye-baby. Read a book before going to sleep.
 22. The hit song "Rock Lobster" was a fantastical rhyme about
sea animals. Read a book of rhymes..
 23. Read a book in a rocking chair.
 24. Rocket woman or rocket man. Read a book about someone who
reached for the stars.
 25. Written in stone. Ask an older person to suggest a book from when
they were young.
